


Figure 2: Wood and stucco detailing.



Original brick chimney on the south elevation covered over with stucco and stone, and replacement leaded glass window on the east elevation.






Rear (west) elevation, looking east.




Rear (west) and south elevation, with the 1941 rear addition by Miles Bain outlined in red.


Original 1933 plan showing the north elevation with sweeping roofline and gable peak detailing.




Plan showing south elevation with "old brick" chimney and covered front porch with Carmel stone.
